

The Department of Biology, University of Central Florida offers one competitive two-year assistantship in the field of mathematical ecology to a full time graduate student to help defray the cost of tuition and provide a summer stipend (\$1300 for tuition and \$ 6000 for summer salary). The successful applicant will also be considered separately for a teaching assistantship from the Department for the fall and spring semesters (\$5000/semester plus tuition and health benefits).
